A Look Ahead

Ice Maintenance Help Required – From Bruce Andrews - It's my hope to instruct several curlers on how to clean, pebble and nip the ice between games. To do this I will conduct one or two pebbling workshops at the end of September. Once the ice is installed, I will hold another one or two workshops to show how to perform the clean, pebble and nip on the ice. Reasoning behind this; the pebble usually only holds up for 8 ends (sometime 10) of curling before it goes "flat" and the curl becomes excessive. To make the game more enjoyable, I would like to ask the convenors to build in 5-10 minutes between draws. This will allow for a clean, pebble and nip to refresh the ice for the next game.

Speed up the Game - From the Board – Next season you will notice the "Speed up the Game" posters around the club, but thought we would give you a heads up and friendly reminder what we can do to keep things on track. We are currently having issues with not finishing on time resulting in different solutions, but no consistency. Hopefully this will help without having to enforce any rules of ending your game early.
