


Ice is Out



When curling stops, there are still 3-4 weeks of work for our Ice Techs! A majority of the lines that run the length of the ice are just ribbon. These get laid and removed individually. Once the ice is all removed the sheets get hung up to dry from the ceiling to get all the moisture out to ensure they are put away as dry as can be to ensure a long lifespan which saves the club money.

Thanks Bruce and Kevin for all of your work getting the ice out!









Right from the Ice Techs!!

Start Dates:

- → Chiller started on Friday, September 30th at 2:00PM
- First flood Sunday, October 2st
- Curling started on Saturday, October 15th for The Swing and Sweep Bonspiel

End Dates:

- Curling ended Saturday, April 1, In-House Closing Bonspiel
- Chiller shutdown on Sunday, April 2nd at 9:00AM
- → Ice out and clean up completed Monday, April 17th

Some Facts:

- Total amount of water flooded 3021 gallons (1 3/8" thickness) to make the ice surface
- Chiller System
 - Chiller System ran for 184 days
 - Chiller running hours 4341
 - Brine Pump running hours 2570
 - Brine Pump starts 1675
 - Chiller Compressor running hours 2097
 - + Chiller compressor starts 5110
 - ◆ Total power usage 54305 kWh
 - Total cost approximately \$10,868.13

Ice preparation:

- → The season was 161 days or 23 weeks in length
- First half: 7 leagues, 2 x L2C classes and Juniors (this equals 16 draw times), with nine ice preparations per week
- Second half: 8 leagues, 1 x L2C (this equals 18 draw times) eleven ice preparations per week
- Bonspiels: There were 14 bonspiels and 3 senior curling tournaments (during each event the ice was Mopped, Pebbled and Nipped after either 2-6 enders or after each 8 end game)

Manpower:

- Coverage for the curling season was performed by Kevin Byam, Steve "Bubba" Smith and Bruce Andrews. The Ice Team covered all but 10 days of the season.
- Alain Bellefeuille also helped with the Mop-Pebble-Nip (MPN) throughout the year, mainly Friday nights before the last draw.
- Bubba came to Lancaster CC to cover for Bruce's vacation. He was a great addition to the club and mentor to Kevin.
- In the future, training of ice assistants to MPN the ice between draws will be conducted. This will include pebbling seminars while ice is out to help assistants become comfortable in the method of pebbling.
